



So what now?

You've learned about Pakistan.

You've heard stories about the children that live there.

You know how difficult it is for them to get a good education.

You know that people like PEP are trying to help them.

What can YOU do about it?

Here are some of our ideas, feel free to think of your own!

- Pray for the children in Pakistan, especially the girls, that they will have access to good schools and be able to afford them.
- Pray that God will call people like YOU to help tell them about how much God loves them.
- Support the work PEP is doing by having a fundraiser with your class, neighborhood, or sports team! You could offer to rake leaves, walk dogs, wash cars, teach elderly people about computers, or sing Christmas Carols for donations! Think of the abilities God has given you and how you might use them.
- You could also have a bake sale, yard sale, charity dinner, pancake breakfast, game night or quiz bowl- the possibilities are endless! PEP needs your support to continue our schools and build new ones to educate more children in Pakistan!
- Ask your friends or family members to give to PEP instead of getting you a Christmas or birthday gift this year. Or give to PEP instead of giving someone else a gift yourself! What an incredible way to honor someone!
- Save your allowance for a month and donate it to PEP. If you saved even 50 cents every week for a year, you would be able to donate \$26! If you saved \$1 every week, you would be able to donate \$52 at the end of the year!
- Ask your Sunday School teacher if you could tell the class about Pakistan and the schools that PEP is building. (Your teacher could give you some materials.) Ask if the class wants to choose PEP to donate to this Christmas or for another special occasion.
- Commit to learning more about Pakistan and how you can make a difference in the lives of the children living there.
